2. CHECK OUT THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS and DATES AND DEADLINES at <http://www.belmont.edu/prospectivestudents/freshmen/deadlines.html>
3. COMPLETE a **Common Application** on the Common Application's website. On this site, you can track the status of your application's completion. <https://www.commonapp.org/CommonApp/default.aspx>.
4. COMPLETE the Belmont Supplement on the Common App website. When you specify that you are applying to Belmont, the supplementary application will appear on the Belmont portal of the website.
2. COMPLETE Admissions Requirements:
 - A. SUBMIT official High School Transcripts through the Guidance Office.
 - B. SUBMIT a \$50 non-refundable application fee. Fee waivers for eligible students can be found on the NACAC website: <http://www.nacacnet.org/studentinfo/feewaiver/Documents/ApplicationFeeWaiver.pdf>
 - C. CONSIDER SUBMITTING your official ACT or SAT scores. Please be sure to enter the Belmont University school code (**3946**) on your ACT application.
 - D. TRACK your admissions status through your Common Application account.
 - E. CONSIDER applying for the Belmont Honors Program.
5. APPLY for your PIN number (and parent's PIN number if needed) at www.pin.ed.gov.
6. COMPLETE the FAFSA (FREE Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.ed.gov .
(Vanderbilt College Code: **003479**) **MUST BE COMPLETED BY JANUARY 15** for eligibility for some scholarships.
7. SEARCH Institutional Scholarships at <http://www.belmont.edu/sfs/scholarships/index.html>. **APPLICATION FOR SCHOLARSHIPS IS DUE DECMEBER 1.**
